1.Introduction

1.1 Digital Education and Learning Strategy (DELS)

- The World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) has identified digital learning as a strategic priority in line with its "Grow Impact" and "Be Athlete Centered" goals. To maximize the impact of WADA's investment in Digital Education and Learning a <u>Digital Education and Learning Strategy</u> (DELS) was developed by the Education team and included in the Education Committee Chair's report to the Executive Committee in May 2023. The purpose of the strategy is to enable Anti-Doping Organizations (ADOs) to educate their target audiences such as athletes, coaches, and parents, and to continue to support the technical development of practitioners through WADA's Global Learning and Development Framework (GLDF) and its Code Implementation Support Program (CISP).
- The strategy contains the vision for learning enabled by technology and serves as the foundation for the direction of WADA's Learning Management System (LMS) platform known as Anti-Doping Education and Learning (ADEL), with the goal of hosting accessible educational opportunities for athletes, athlete support personnel, administrators, and professionals working in the anti-doping industry, as well as enabling ADOs to fulfill their responsibilities under the World Anti-Doping Code (Code) and the International Education Standard (ISE).
- It is essential to continue monitoring developments in accordance with the DELS so that progress can be evaluated, and challenges, opportunities, and trends can be identified. This Three Years On report serves to provide an update on the first year of implementation of DELS, as well as give an overview of the progress of WADA's digital education and learning offerings since the introduction of ADEL in 2021.

1.2 Overview of ADEL

- On 6 January 2021, WADA launched a new and improved ADEL platform, which was a complete overhaul of WADA's initial LMS launched in 2018.
- ADEL is the centralized platform primarily offering educational solutions for ADOs to complement or
 use in their education programs or to extend the reach of their existing education programs. Education
 solutions available on ADEL include courses, programs and resources for athletes, coaches, parents,
 medical professionals and other target audiences as identified in the Code and ISE.
- Additionally, on ADEL, anti-doping practitioners can access learning opportunities such as training programs to help them carry out their roles through the GLDF; and a wide range of digital resources to support the development of their anti-doping programs through the CISP.
- The use and access to ADEL is free with the objective to maximize the reach of, and access to, quality education and learning opportunities to benefit all audiences, especially those working in or



supporting the goal of clean sport. ADEL is for everyone, and anyone interested in learning more about anti-doping and protecting the values of clean sport. With a stable internet connection, ADEL can be accessed at any time, from anywhere. The 'ADEL by WADA' mobile app is available on the Apple Store and Google Play store, enabling users to learn on the go and complete their education offline.

2. Highlights of 2023

- The digital learning team focused on bringing the daily operations into alignment with the framework of the new strategy. Education solutions have been designed and structured to correspond to each developmental stage along the athlete pathway and the translation process has enabled more than 45 ADOs to use courses on ADEL as part of their education programs.
- Within 3 years since the launch of ADEL, there was a steep increase in user engagement, with the
 average number of monthly active users reaching 10,210. When compared to year 2022, there has been
 a 68.18% increase in active users.

Pre-event education collaboration with MEOs

- In collaboration with the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA), WADA helped support pre-event education for the 2023 Asian Games, which led to a significant increase in the number of Asian athletes who were required to complete the International-Level Athletes (ILA) education program on ADEL.
- Working in collaboration with the International Olympic Committee (IOC) and International Testing Agency (ITA), WADA published the ADEL for Talented Athletes Competing at Major Events which is intended to be used for pre-event education for the 2024 Gangwon Youth Olympic Games and other events.
- Likewise, WADA launched the ADEL for Paris 2024 Olympic Games targeting athletes and coaches aiming to participate at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.
- To refresh and reinforce the learner's knowledge and equip users with the most up-to-date anti-doping information and knowledge, a recertification program for ILA, National-Level Athletes (NLA) and Coaches of High-Performance athletes (CHP) was launched beginning of 2023. The new course content and format has been developed in response to the feedback from learners who had previously completed relevant courses. The purpose of refresher courses is to revalidate learning after a two-year period.
- Strategic KPIs measurement showed (Target level is at 70%):
 - o 72% of athletes were satisfied with the level of education offered
 - 71% of ADEL learners are confident in what they have learned
- An accessibility audit has been conducted and courses were updated with the improvements to be compatible with the WCAG 2.1 guidelines.



- ADEL has significantly improved its user interface to be more intuitive, modern and accessible. This has been updated based on feedback from platform users.
- A total of 160 practitioners were enrolled in 2023 in role specific GLDF training programs in the areas of Education, Results Management, Investigations & Intelligence, TUE, Testing, Results Management, Privacy and Data Protection, and Communication and Media Relations. Communities of Learning were launched to offer further professional development opportunities to practitioners who participated in GLDF training.

Enhanced ADEL user interface (UI)

• In line with the feedback from users, the platform user interface (UI) has been improved to make the landing page more intuitive to find relevant resources and languages, customized for specific roles.

Accessibility review



- Accessibility audit has been conducted by an accessibility expert and courses were updated to be compatible with the WCAG 2.1 guidelines.
- ILA, NLA, TA, HPC and Sports Values Online for children's course in English have been republished.

Helpdesk support

- Maintaining, analyzing, and troubleshooting inquiries from end users has continued throughout the year with a significant rise in new users onboard.
 - Different categories of user inquiries have been identified including sign in and registration, certificates, Power User and translation requests. The Helpdesk ticket submission page has been updated accordingly.

Focus for 2024


- Further enhance the user interface by soliciting feedback from stakeholders, including athletes, who make
 up the vast majority of users.
- Embed accessibility requirements when developing new resources (courses, PDF materials) that adhere to the WCAG 2.1 Guidelines. This will be done in conjunction with the annual accessibility audit.
- Regarding the LMS, we will plan for any potential changes or revisions with the current supplier and secure an agreement for the future.
- Further analysis of common user issues will be carried out. The goal is to update existing and add new
 instructional articles to the helpdesk to promote self-service and increase the efficiency of responding
 inquiries.

Recertification program

- As learning needs to be reinforced periodically to support behavioral development and to ensure that knowledge remains current and up to date, the first recertification program for ILA, NLA, and CHP has been launched in 2023.
- Those who have completed their education programs (ILA, NLA, CHP) in 2021 have been notified to go through a refresher course when their two-year period is expiring (31 days before the certificate expiry date).
- The recertification program was targeted for higher-level education programs (ILA/NLA in particular) as a talented athlete would move to complete the NLA course according to their athlete pathway.

Focus for 2024

- We will reassess the content development plan to prioritize the development of education programs and courses in line with the athlete pathway. In accordance with this, we will review clean sport behaviors and reassess the ASP curricula.
- Enhance the personalized dashboard with course recommendations that align with the learner's relevant stage and interest.
- We will continue to enhance the ADEL roadmap page, which will include the content development plan as well as available courses and resources with ongoing translations, for ADO stakeholders.

According to CCQ data, 66.07% of Tier 1 signatories referred to ADEL in their Education Plans, 58.33% of Tier 2 Signatories, and 46.5% of Tier 3 signatories.

Increase of power users

- ADEL enables ADOs to become "Power Users" (Authorized ADEL administrators) to manage their
 education programs and target pools actively and directly, including monitoring user progress. A simple
 reporting dashboard and customized report functionality is in place for power users to run reports.
- There are 16 power users who have been given rights to monitor learners' progress and run reports through the ADEL platform.

Increase of translation

- A robust translation process is in place to support our ADO stakeholders to engage in working with reviewing the machine translation, resulting in shortening the duration and costs of publishing courses on the platform.
- 45 ADOs have engaged in translating different resources on ADEL. Out of the different courses and resources, ADEL for ILA is now available in 25 languages, with 10 new languages in 2023, and the Athletes' Guide to the 2021 Code is available in 34 languages with 8 new languages added in 2023.

Focus for 2024

- Exploring ways to streamline workflows for translation management to maximize the usage of resources.
- Having a solid Power User Support plan in place and a better understanding of ADOs who are in need
 of utilizing ADEL to educate their Education Pool.
- Finding a solution to better communicate and share any updates of the ADEL roadmap to power users/ADOs.
- Collaborating with MEOs to grant them the necessary power user permissions to monitor completion.
- Creating education resources that are downloadable for ADOs to use offline in face-to-face sessions.

Community of learning

 The platform features community learning channels for ADO practitioners to support knowledge sharing, Q&A and the ability to showcase resources relevant for specific subgroups of users (Regional Anti-Doping Organizations, ABP and APMU Experts, etc.). The team continued to assist internal departments' use of the channels to host webinars and archive training resources.

GLDF

- 7 new eLearning modules for the GLDF **testing** training program were added to ADEL.
- ADEL hosts 7 Channels for different roles: Education, Results Management, Investigations & Intelligence, TUE, Testing, Results Management, Privacy and Data Protection, and Communication and media relations. The completion of eLearning modules by participants is consistently monitored.
- A total of 160 practitioners were enrolled in 2023 in role-specific training programs.
- Communities of Learning were launched to offer further professional development opportunities to practitioners who participated in GLDF training.

CISP

- CISP hosted on ADEL provides guidance, support, and resources to assist ADOs in their implementation of the 2021 Code and International Standards. It currently counts over 300 resources, including factsheets, templates video tutorials, checklists, presentations, recorded webinars, and templates, with the majority available in English, French, and Spanish.
- As of 31 December 2023, CISP has experienced more than 42,000 interactions (since 2020), highlighting
 the demand from practitioners to access helpful resources, available digitally at any time, to support them
 in their work. In 2023, the CISP team wound down the development of resources apart from specific
 needs identified following revisions to the International Standards or Guidelines or from the Code
 Compliance Questionnaire (CCQ) reviews.

Focus for 2024

- Work closely with the GLDF team in strengthening the tech support for eLearning modules and communities of learning.
- Further enhance the UI and search engine for ADO practitioners for optimized navigation and results.
- Prepare a plan with the CISP team to update the current resources on ADEL to support the 2027 Code implementation.

Pre-Games education course

- WADA collaborated with the IOC and ITA to develop the Talented Athletes Competing at a Major Event course, which is not event specific, but will be suitable for Gangwon Youth Olympics 2024 in addition to many other international events for minors.
- Likewise, OCA has made the ILA education program mandatory for athletes who are competing at the 19th Asian Games in Hangzhou, China as a pre-games education solution.
- In close collaboration with the different MEOs, the pre-games ADEL courses were promoted on respective websites and social media platforms.

Focus for 2024

- Understand EdTech trends and collaborate with stakeholders to improve learners' digital learning experiences.
- Support the pre-event education for Paris 2024 Olympics and Paralympic Games.
- Collaborate with MEOs to conduct monitoring and evaluation of the pre-games education carried out to make necessary adjustments for future planning.

Measurement strategy

- Since 2022, as part of WADA's monitoring of its own performance, strategic KPIs have been tracked annually to assess learner satisfaction, confidence in applying what they have learned, and likelihood of referring ADEL.
- Learner performance is also being monitored to ensure that they are engaged with the training content and achieving the learning objectives.
 - In 2023, we piloted analyzing the user's performance in the final quiz for the ADEL for the Registered Testing Pool (RTP) course (English). Patterns were identified and recommendations were made based on user responses.

Focus for 2024


- Measuring performance aligned with the measurement strategy so that decisions are data driven.
- Examining the recommendations analyzed from the RTP course and plan to implement for future course development.
 - Set up key learning indicators for further data collection and analysis, for instance, time spent per module, completion rate, comparing ILA and refresher course quiz results.
- Seeking feedback from power users who are analyzing the learning outcomes to monitor and evaluate their programs.



4.ADEL - Statistics and Trends


4.1 User growth

- During the three-year period of 2021–2023, ADEL was used by more than 367k users from 236 countries who participate in 230 different sports. The users have seen an increase in number in 3 aspects:
 - 1. Number of users from new countries coming to ADEL
 - In 2021, ADEL was being used by users from <u>173</u> countries; by 2023, that number had risen to <u>236</u> countries.




- 2. Number of countries that had a substantial growth in users
 - In 2022, 61 countries had over 500 registered users; by 2023, 89 countries had over 500 registered users on ADEL with Slovenia's user base doubling (45,200), Mexico's (38,500) users five times larger and Japan's users (8,500) three times larger than it was in 2022.






- 3. Number of sports that had a substantial growth in users
 - In 2022, 85 sports had more than 50 registered users; by 2023, 136 sports had more than 50 registered users on ADEL with Gymnastics (FIG) leading in total number of registered users (26,630), Football (FIFA) increasing their user pool by 5 times (19,300) and Volleyball (FIVB) also doubling its user pool (11,100) compared to 2022. The top ten sports on the list each have an average of 10,000 users.






4.2 Completion of Education Programs




- Along with the translation of existing courses and the additional courses that have been published in the last 3 years, the number of completions has grown from 121K completions to 667K completions. Most of the users who completed their education programs were athletes.
- i) Completion of International-Level Athletes Education Program






4.3 Languages

4.4 Power Users


- With a total of 169 power users, most of them are NADOs (129) followed by IFs (38).
