

International Standard (ISTUE) – Changes from November 2019 to June 2020

2. Introduction Page

The fifth effective ISTUE date was changed from 2018 to 2016:

International Standard for Therapeutic Use Exemptions

The World Anti-Doping Code International Standard for Therapeutic Use Exemptions is a mandatory International Standard developed as part of the World Anti-Doping Program. It was developed in consultation with Signatories, public authorities and other relevant stakeholders.

The International Standard for Therapeutic Use Exemptions was first adopted in 2004 and came into effect on 1 January 2005. It was subsequently amended six times, the first-time effective January 2009, the second effective January 2010, the third effective January 2011, the fourth effective January 2015, the fifth effective January 2016, the sixth effective January 2019. A revised version was approved by the *WADA* Executive Committee at the World Conference on Doping in Sport in Katowice on 7 November 2019 and is effective as of 1 January 2021.

3. Definition Administration:

Administration: Providing, supplying, supervising, facilitating, or otherwise participating in the Use or Attempted Use by another Person of a Prohibited Substance or Prohibited Method. However, this definition shall not include the actions of bona fide medical personnel involving a Prohibited Substance or Prohibited Method usedUsed for genuine and legal therapeutic purposes or other acceptable justification and shall not include actions involving Prohibited Substances which are not prohibited in Out-of-Competition Testing unless the circumstances as a whole demonstrate that such Prohibited Substances are not intended for genuine and legal therapeutic purposes or are intended to enhance sport performance.



4. Definition National Anti-Doping Organization:

National Anti-Doping Organization: The entity(ies) designated by each country as possessing the primary authority and responsibility to adopt and implement anti-doping rules, direct the collection of Samples, the management of manage test results, and the conduct of hearings <u>Results Management</u> at the national level. If this designation has not been made by the competent public authority(ies), the entity shall be the country's National Olympic Committee or its designee.

5. Definition *Prohibited List*:

Prohibited List: The Listlist identifying the Prohibited Substances and Prohibited Methods.

6. Definition Recreational Athlete:

Recreational Athlete: A natural Person who is so defined by the relevant National Anti-Doping Organization; provided, however, the term shall not include any Person who, within the five (5) years prior to committing any anti-doping rule violation, has been an International-Level Athlete (as defined by each International Federation consistent with the International Standard for Testing and Investigations) or National-Level Athlete (as defined by each National Anti-Doping Organization consistent with the International Standard for Testing and Investigations), has represented any country in an International Event in an open category or has been included within any Registered Testing Pool or other whereabouts information pool maintained by any International Federation or National Anti-Doping Organization.

7. Article 3.4.6

The "International Standard for Therapeutic Use Exemptions" was abbreviated to "International Standard":

3.4.6 The Annexes to the International Standard for Therapeutic Use Exemptions have the same mandatory status as the rest of the International Standard for Therapeutic-Use Exemptions.
